Travel Information

From the Airport to the Downtown Seattle

The Seattle airport is located approximately 15 miles (24km) from downtown, the Washington State Convention Center and nearby hotels.

A number of transportation options are available, e.g., taxi (\$60), shuttle bus (\$20) and light rail (\$3). If you have a rental car, parking is available at downtown hotels and at the Convention Center, starting at \$12 per day.

Link Light Rail: Runs from SeaTac Airport to Westlake Center which is close to the Washington State Convention Center. To take the light rail from the airport to downtown:

- Follow signs to "Link Light Rail" Thru Parking Garage Level 4
- When you get to the station, buy a full-fare ticket from the machine and go upstairs to the train going in the direction of Westlake (the only direction).
- Ride the rain to the Westlake station, which is downtown under Pine Street, between Third and Sixth. Walk upstairs to Pine Street, then to your hotel.
- Duration is 38 minutes. Cost is \$2.75.

The train runs every 15 minutes during non-peak times, and twice as often during rush hour.
